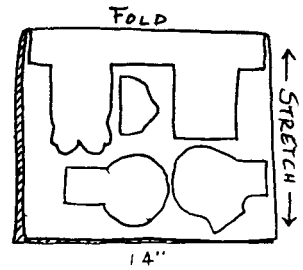
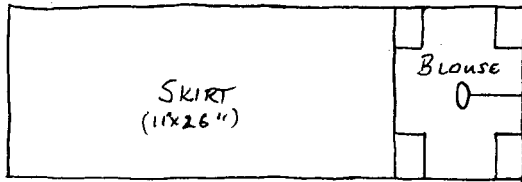


# Cutting Instructions

**Doll body:** Be sure to cut doll body parts with **greatest stretch of fabric going in the direction shown on the pattern**. The fabric should stretch **across** the doll's body, not up and down on her body.



**Dresses:** Follow the diagram to cut the Pig's blouse and skirt from the off-white Osnaburg, and Goldie's blouse and skirt from the calico.

## General Instructions

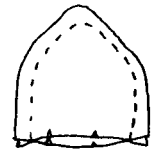
All seams are 1/4".

Make any necessary marks on fabric with a pencil, taking care to thoroughly cover the pencil marks when you stitch over them.

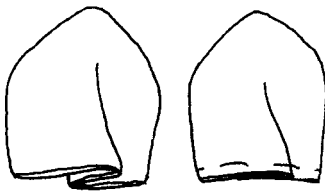
## Making the Pig's Head

**Step 1.** Mark fold lines and dots on ears and head (Patterns No. 1 and 2).

**Step 2.** Place two ear pieces right sides together, and sew around curved edges, leaving straight bottom edge open. Clip seam allowance along curves, and turn ear right side out. Press flat.

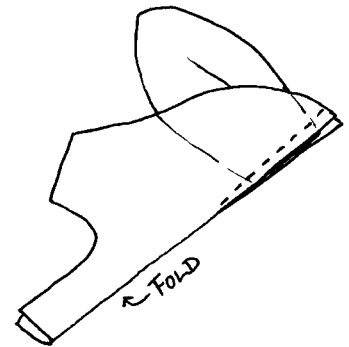


**Step 3.** Repeat with remaining two ear pieces.



**Step 4.** Fold one ear as shown on pattern to form a pleat in the ear. Baste along the bottom of the ear to hold the pleat in place. Repeat with second ear, being sure to fold pleat in opposite direction, so that pleats are symmetrical when placed on the pig's head.

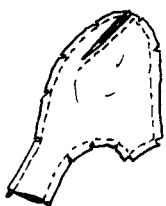
**Step 5.** On head pieces, slit ear dart to first dot. Fold head piece with right sides together so that dart seam edges match. Slip ear into dart seam, with raw edges lining up with edges of dart seam. Be sure to place ear so that it is at least 1/4" from edges of head so that it won't be caught in the head seam later.



**Step 6.** Sew dart, stitching ear into seam.

**Step 7.** Repeat Steps 5 and 6 with second ear.

**Step 8.** With right sides together, sew around outside edge of head, taking care not to catch ears into the seam. Clip curves and corners, and turn right side out.



**Step 9. Alternate ear construction** (recommended for less experienced seamstresses):

- a. Complete Step 1 as instructed.
- b. With right sides together, sew head darts.
- c. With right sides together, sew head pieces together. Clip curves and corners, and turn right side out.
- d. Sew ears as instructed in Steps 2 and 3.
- e. Finish bottom of ears by turning edges to the inside  $\frac{1}{4}$ ." Whip stitch closed.



f. Fold both ears on fold lines as instructed in Step 4 and baste to hold fold in place.

g. Using a small whipstitch, sew ears to head along dart seams.

**Step 10.** Attach button to end of nose so that it faces toward you.



**Step 11.** Sew gold ring to stitching on button so that the ring lays flat against the button.

**Step 12.** Stuff head with polyester batting, taking care to stuff firmly so that head does not flop around.

**Step 13.** Sew neck closed with whipstitch.

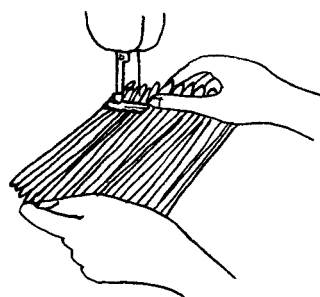
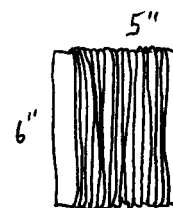
**Step 14.** Attach moveable eyes where indicated on pattern, or place them where they look best to you.



**Step 15.** If desired, use one or two strands of black embroidery floss to embroider a mouth and eyebrows on your pig's face.

## Making Goldie's Head

**Step 16.** With a piece of cardboard that measures 5" x 6", wrap 15-20 yd. of yarn around the 6" side, spreading the yarn along the entire length of the cardboard.



**Step 17.** Carefully slip yarn off of cardboard, keeping it spread out as it was on the cardboard. Sew through yarn,  $\frac{3}{4}$ "-1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " from one edge (depending on how long you want Goldie's bangs to be). Hold the yarn firmly on both sides of the sewing machine needle to prevent the yarn from bunching up when you sew through it.

**Step 18.** Match head pieces, Pattern No. 3, right sides together. Sew around head, leaving lower neck open.
